Here are a few tips to help you prepare: Make sure that you know the material well before the exam. This will help you feel more confident when speaking in front of the examiner. The best way to improve your French speaking skills is to practice as often as possible. Try talking to native speakers or recording yourself speaking French to see where you need improvement. The examiner is just trying to get to know you better. Dont worry if you make a mistake, everyone makes mistakes sometimes. Just relax Are you in school? In French class you learned the conditional tense? Well during the French oral exam, use the conditional tense. It may seem obvious, but often, because of stress, students will want to make the simplest and shortest answers possible and will forget to show what they know. Are you taking the DELF exam? During the oral exam, show the examiner that you know the vocabulary and grammar of the DELF level you are taking. Even if you could give a simpler answer, remember that this is an exam and the examiner wants to see if you have the level. Do you know the subjunctive? Yes ?? Great, then use it! Quel ge as-tu ? (How old are you?) In French, we use the verb avoir to answer. Jai xx ans ! (I am xx years old!) Ive seen B2 students start their DELF B2 exam by answering: Je suis 22 ans The French oral exam starts badly Do viens-tu ? (Where are you from?) With this question, all of a sudden, students dont understand the: do (from where). I dont know why they hear : doux? dou? Huh????? No, no, Where are you from? means: Do viens-tu ? or Tu viens do ?. Its as simple as that The French oral exam is definitely a daunting task, but if you prepare for it and know what to expect, youll be just fine. So, the next time your teacher tells you that you have an oral exam coming up, dont panic! Just use these tips to help you prepare and practice so that you can show off all that French knowledge that youve been working so hard on.
