Published: 31 December 2024 Developing spoken language is crucial. For support with hearing technology, consult Audiology, a Teacher of the Deaf, or a Speech and Language Therapist. However, keep in mind that hearing through technology differs from typical hearing - sound quality may be less clear and distinct for each child. To help deaf children develop their listening skills, consider: wearing hearing technology during waking hours; reducing background noise; engaging in musical activities like singing action songs together; using a sing-song voice when saying your child's name; and incorporating repetitive phrases into daily routines. Your Speech and Language Therapist or Teacher of the Deaf may recommend specific activities tailored to your child's needs. For parents who are deaf, learning British Sign Language (BSL) can be beneficial, as it's a full language without spoken words. In some cases, parents might choose to learn signs for use alongside spoken language (Sign Supported English). Speech and Language Therapists and Teachers of the Deaf can provide guidance on these topics. You can directly book appointments with certain health services in Medway and Swale, which are provided by Medway Community Healthcare (MCH). Fill out an online or paper referral form to schedule your appointment. Note: The service only accepts patients with a Medway and Swale GP. take all medication as usual with water before the test except for Digoxin which needs to be taken at least six hours prior. If you are having a fasting blood test, medication taken with food should wait until after the test. for genetic tests, book a morning appointment Monday to Thursday for lab processing.our call center sees the same appointments online as we do and cannot provide earlier appointments. Clinics are held in various venues and require booking appointments in advance through our online system up to six weeks prior: if you can't book online, call 0300 123 3444 option 1 then option 1 again.if you need a sooner appointment, contact your GP for alternative options.can be booked for relatives or friends by adding them to your account. For children, appointments require more time due to reassurance and calming before the test.a booked appointment sets a specific time for the test, reducing anxiety prior to the appointment, ensure numbing cream is applied 30-45 minutes prior. on the day, bring blood form or F number code given by GP. wear sleeves rolled up, and have coats off. That being said, some people may find it challenging to handle certain medical procedures, including blood draws. It's essential to stay calm and composed during such tests. If you're feeling anxious, take slow, deep breaths and try to relax. You can also ask the phlebotomist to explain their process to help alleviate any concerns. A peaceful mindset can make the experience less stressful for both you and the healthcare professional. Before your blood test, it's a good idea to discuss your medical history with the phlebotomist, including any instances of fainting in the past. This will enable them to take necessary precautions to ensure your comfort and safety throughout the procedure. Having a friend or family member accompany you may also be helpful, as they can provide support and assistance if needed. You can also call 0300 123 3444 from Monday to Friday 8am to 4pm. When prompted, choose Option 1 twice and provide your Blood Form number and NHS number. Blood tests are used to diagnose and treat various health conditions. Before your test: - Fast glucose tests: Have nothing to eat for 10 hours and drink only tap water. - Cholesterol tests: Have nothing to eat for 12 hours and drink only tap water. - Fasting lipids: Have nothing to eat for 12 hours and drink only tap water. Take all medication with you, except Digoxin, which cannot be taken less than six hours before a blood test. Our clinics offer drop-in services at various venues. No appointment is necessary, but some may need to change their times due to unforeseen circumstances. For children's blood tests, choose between attending the drop-in clinics or booking an appointment. Booked appointments ensure set times for the test and reduce waiting time. Booking an appointment beforehand is crucial as our clinics operate on an appointment-only basis, meaning you need to schedule your visit in advance. If it's your child who needs the blood test, make sure to book online and allocate some extra time to help them feel more at ease before the test. Having a scheduled appointment means you'll have a set time for the test, avoiding any potential waiting time that might increase your child's anxiety levels beforehand.
