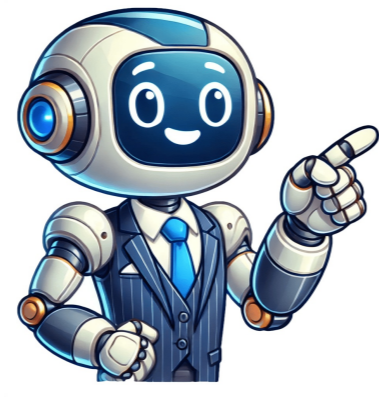

This simply means your audio is connected. On mobile devices, a persistent green bar at the top of your screen will let you know this too. To disconnect from a channel, tap Voice Connected and then hit the end-call button.If your server allows it, you can also turn on your camera for video chats. The active video screens will appear in the main panel. To access all your connected accounts and linked platforms, follow these steps:You can link your Discord account with other services—like Xbox, PlayStation, PayPal, TikTok, or YouTube. This is helpful if you want to switch between consoles or chat while playing cross-platform games. To do this, go into User Settings > Connections, then click on what you'd like to add and follow the instructions. To share your gameplay or stream other videos, try these methods:Firstly, you can share your screen in a Voice channel. (Make sure your server admins allow video sharing.) In the bottom left panel, select Share Your Screen. Choose the window you want to share and set up your streaming preferences. Then, click Go Live and you'll be broadcasting. You can also stream games directly from Xbox if it's linked to Discord. Just tap the main Xbox button, go into Parties & Chat > Discord, and use Discord's voice chat and streaming features. To control what others see about you, check your privacy settings:Discord displays a lot of info about you by default. If you want to hide some of this, review your privacy settings in User Settings > Privacy & Safety. There, you can filter out NSFW messages and servers, decide who can message you, and control the data you send back to Discord. Your activity will also be visible to others by default. To change this, tap your profile pic, select a status (Online, Idle, Do Not Disturb, or Invisible), and choose Invisible if you want to appear offline and hide your activity. In User Settings > Activity Settings, you can uncheck "Display current activity as a status message" to keep your activity hidden even when you're set to Online.Also, in your Connections tab in User Settings, you'll find options for limiting what info about your connected accounts is displayed. For instance, if you have PlayStation or Xbox linked, you can toggle off whether your username and status on those platforms are shown. Some Discord servers may require you to familiarize yourself with their rules before posting, so be sure to do that. In contrast, XLR microphones are still industry standards due to their versatility in capturing multiple audio sources. They can be plugged into a preamp or mixer board, offering more flexibility than USB mics. It features a field effect transistor (FET) preamp and large diaphragm, resulting in a robust signal with balanced output. The MXL 990 comes with a shock mount, mic stand adapter, and carrying case, making it a great investment for those looking to expand their studio setup. Before upgrading your studio, consider how to connect an XLR mic. You can purchase a USB mic and retire it on upgrade or opt for an XLR-to-USB adapter like the Shure X2U. This device bridges the gap between your XLR microphone and computer, providing phantom power for proper function. Other features include a headphone jack, monitor and volume control, and gain control for optimal input. The adapter's versatility allows it to be used with laptops even after upgrading to a mixer board. When working with USB mics, you're limited to one source per mic, whereas XLR microphones can recognize multiple audio sources independently. A mic stand is crucial if you're using an XLR mic that doesn't come with one or if you want more flexibility in your setup. Boom mic stands like the Rode Boom Mic Stand are fantastic, but they do come at a higher cost. These stands lift the microphone off the desk, freeing up space and promoting better posture. They can also be used to organize your workspace during events or interviews. While not essential for starting out on Discord, boom mic stands are something to consider for future upgrades.
