The SEC and Big Ten are the two best leagues in the sport, and it feels like the SEC has once again shown itself to hold the national title favorite. Not just because five of the top six teams ranked here are from the SEC, but because Michigan showed it could win against a ranked opponent in the Big Ten while being one-dimensional, but also get beat soundly by an SEC team (Texas) at the same venue.Oklahoma proved to boast one of the nation's top defenses, but the Sooners got beat by double digits at home because the offense could not hold up their end. In the SEC, being one-dimensional doesn't lead to wins. In the Big Ten, you can beat a ranked opponent with a QB who isn't a threat to beat you down the field.With Georgia and Alabama set as the marquee matchup for Week 5, the question won't be whether one will make the College Football Playoff, but rather where they will be seeded.With that, here is a look at my top 25 rankings following Week 4 of the college football season:1. Georgia (3-0)Week 4 result: Idle2. Texas (4-0)Week 4 result: Defeated UL Monroe, 51-3In Arch Manning's debut as a starter, the Longhorns outscored the Warhawks 21-0 in the first quarter. Manning finished 15-of-29 for 258 passing yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions. Texas running back Jaydon Blue added 124 rushing yards and three touchdowns in the win.3. Ohio State (3-0)Week 4 result: Defeated Marshall, 49-14Ohio State put up 369 yards of offense on just 57 plays. Running back Quinshon Judkins rushed for 173 yards on just 14 rushes, while Tre'Yvon Henderson added 76 yards and two scores in the win. The Buckeyes had four plays of 40 yards or more go for touchdowns. 4. Tennessee (4-0)Week 4 result: Defeated Oklahoma, 25-15Tennessee's offense didn't need to do much to earn a win against a top-20 opponent on the road. The Vols' defense sacked Oklahoma quarterbacks three times and forced three turnovers in a game where its offense struggled to do much at all. Winning an ugly game against a quality opponent is the mark of a national title contender.5. Ole Miss (4-0)Week 4 result: Defeated Georgia Southern, 52-13Lane Kiffin's Rebels haven't played a ranked opponent yet. In fact, only one of the Rebels' opponents, Wake Forest, plays in a Power 4 Conference. But Kiffin's team has scored at least 40 points in every game it has played and has allowed a total of 22 points scored through four games ahead of SEC play.6. Alabama (3-0)Week 4 result: Idle7. Penn State (3-0)Week 4 result: Defeated Kent State, 56-0Drew Allar hit 17 of 21 passes for 309 yards with three touchdowns in a decisive victory. The Nittany Lions outgained the Golden Flashes 718 yards to 67. Kent State has now lost its last two games by a combined score of 127-0. 8. Oregon (3-0)Week 4 result: Idle9. Miami (Fla.) (4-0)Week 4 result: Defeated South Florida, 50-15Cam Ward led no doubt about who the best player in the state of Florida is with 40 passing yards, three passing touchdowns and just one interception in a rout of a Bulls team that dragged Alabama into the deep water just two weeks ago.10. Utah (4-0)Week 4 result: Defeated Oklahoma State, 22-19Utah went into Stillwater and left with a win. And the Utes did it with Cam Rising sidelined due to injury.They did it while holding Ollie Gordon to 42 yards on 11 rushes and while getting starting QB Alan Bowman benched for much of the second half.And they did it with Micah Bernard rushing for 162 yards — the most by a Utah tailback against a ranked opponent since 2018. 11. Missouri (4-0)Week 4 result: Defeated Vanderbilt, 30-27 in 20TMissouri running back Nate Noel rushed for 199 yards on 24 carries in a nail-biting win against Vanderbilt. 12. Clemson (2-1)Week 4 result: Defeated NC State, 59-35The Tigers led the Wolfpack 45-7 at halftime. This is the second game in a row in which Clemson has scored at least 59 since scoring just three against Georgia in its season-opener.13. Michigan (3-1)Week 4 result: Defeated USC, 27-24It's not that Kael Mullings rushed for 159 yards on 17 carries. It's that Alex Orji finished just 7-of-12 for 32 yards passing in the win.14. Illinois (4-0)Week 4 result: Defeated Nebraska, 31-24 in OTIllinois QB Luke Altmyer threw for 215 yards and four touchdowns to lead the Illini to their first 4-0 start since 2011 and their second win against a ranked team in the same season since 2007. 15. Iowa State (3-0)Week 4 result: Defeated Arkansas State, 52-7This is the same Arkansas State team that Michigan beat 28-18 one week earlier. The Cyclones are a legitimate Big 12 title contender.16. USC (2-1)Week 4 result: Lost to Michigan, 27-24Miller Moss threw the ball 51 times for 283 yards in the loss. The Trojans looked much-improved on defense through their first three weeks, but with the game on the line, and knowing Michigan wanted to run the ball, D'Anton Lynn's unit couldn't get a stop. USC gave up 290 yards on the ground and got beat by a team who couldn't throw the ball with a catapult.17. Oklahoma (3-1)Week 4 result: Lost to Tennessee, 25-15Oklahoma coach Brent Venables was forced to pull starting quarterback Jackson Arnold in the second quarter after he threw an interception and fumbled the ball inside the Tennessee red zone. He finished 7-of-16 for 54 yards with two turnovers and two sacks. The defense, however, held an offense that was averaging 62.9 points per game this season to just 25.18. BYU (4-0)Week 4 result: Defeated Kansas State, 38-9Despite giving up 224 rushing yards and 130 more yards than they could muster, the Cougars throttled the Wildcats at home for their first win against a ranked opponent this season.19. LSU (3-1)Week 4 result: Defeated UCLA, 34-17Garrett Nussmeier threw for 352 yards with three touchdowns in the Tigers' win over the Bruins. The redshirt junior QB has thrown for 300-plus yards in three of LSU's four games this season. In the one game he didn't throw for 300-plus — a 36-33 win at South Carolina — he threw for 285 and two touchdowns.20. Louisville (3-0)Week 4 result: Defeated Georgia Tech, 31-19Tyler Shough completed 13 of 19 passes for 269 yards in the win. Louisville has won 13 of its first 15 regular-season games in the Jeff Brohm era. 21. Oklahoma State (3-1)Week 4 result: Lost to Utah, 22-19This is a good Oklahoma State win, but going up against Kyle Whittingham and that Utah defense is no easy task. After being benched following an ineffective first half, QB Alan Bowman returned midway through the fourth quarter and threw for two touchdowns, but it wasn't enough as the Pokes suffered their first loss of the season.22. Notre Dame (3-1)Week 4 result: Defeated Miami (OH), 28-3Riley Leonard passed for 154 yards and a touchdown, while also adding 143 yards and two scores on the ground. Notre Dame's defense has given up a total of 10 points in its last two outings.23. Washington State (4-0)Week 4 result: Defeated San Jose State, 54-52Jake Dickert's group is 4-0 following a high-scoring victory over San Jose State. Sophomore QB John Mateer has been a breakout star through the first four weeks of the season. He was outstanding on Friday, throwing for 390 yards and four touchdowns, while adding another 111 yards and a score on the ground.24. UNLV (3-0)Week 4 result: Idle25. Kansas State (3-1)Week 4 result: Lost to BYU, 38-9There's no way around it — this was an ugly loss for Chris Klieman's team. The Commodores' win as more than three-touchdown underdogs caused the Crimson Tide to drop from No. 1 to No. 7. The last top-ranked team to fall so far was Ohio State, which plunged to No. 11 in 2010 following an October loss to Wisconsin. Texas, which had an open date, received 52 of 61 first-place votes and became the first team in two years to bounce in and out of the top spot in a span of three polls. The Longhorns also were just the third team since 2008 to be voted No. 1 after not playing the day before Ohio State beat Iowa for its fourth straight easy win, received nine first-place votes and moved up a spot to No. 2. Oregon and Penn State each score three spots, with the Ducks up to No. 3 and the Nittany Lions fourth. Georgia remained No. 5, Miami, which came back from a 25-point second-half deficit to beat California 39-38, rose two spots to No. 6. The mayhem wasn't limited to Alabama.Six of the 18 AP Top 25 teams that played lost to unranked opponents (33%), the highest mark since six of 16 (38%) lost the first week of October 2020. The Tide were among four teams in the top 11 to lose to unranked opponents — the first time that's happened since Nov. 12, 2016, when five teams did it, according to Sportradar. Tennessee lost to Arkansas and went from No. 4 to No. 8. Michigan lost at Washington and went from No. 10 to No. 24. Southern California lost at Minnesota and went from No. 11 to out of the Top 25. The Trojans were first among teams also receiving votes.Texas A&M soundly beat Missouri at home in the only Top 25 matchup. That earned the Aggies a promotion from a tie for No. 25 to No. 15 and the Tigers a demotion from No. 9 to No. 21. Poll points:The Big Ten dominates the top five, but the Southeastern Conference maintains its grip on the top 10. No. 2 Ohio State, No. 3 Oregon and No. 4 Penn State are bookended by the SEC's Texas and Georgia. The SEC also has Alabama, Tennessee and Mississippi in the top 10.Double-digit drops by Missouri, Michigan and USC mark the first time since Nov. 13, 2016, that three teams fell 10 or more spots in the same poll. That week it happened to Auburn (8 to 18), Texas A&M (10 to 23) and North Carolina (15 to receiving votes).The biggest upward movers were Texas A&M (25 to 15), Clemson (15 to 10) and Iowa State (16 to 11).In-and-outSMU (5-1) was rewarded for knocking off Louisville on the road and enters the rankings at No. 25. The Mustangs have appeared in the Top 25 all but one season (2022) since 2019. Louisville (3-2) has lost two of three and dropped out.Pittsburgh won at North Carolina to start 5-0 for the first time since 1991 and enters the rankings at No. 22 for its first appearance in two years. USC (3-2) has lost two of its first three Big Ten games and is out, as is UNLV, whose first-ever Top 25 appearance was spoiled by an overtime home loss to Syracuse. It's their first head-to-head SEC meeting, and it's a Top 25 matchup for the sixth time in eight games. Sooners scored with 15 seconds left last year to hand Texas its only regular-season loss. Both teams are coming off open dates. — No. 2 Ohio State at No. 3 Oregon. Entering the season, this was billed as a midseason preview of the Big Ten championship game. It still could be. The Buckeyes have won nine of 10 previous meetings, the only loss coming in the most recent one (2021). — No. 9 Mississippi at No. 13 LSU. Huge College Football Playoff implications here. Rebels' Jaxson Dart prevailed 55-49 last year in a dizzying matchup with Heisman winner Jayden Daniels. — This version corrects the last time four top-11 teams lost to unranked opponents. They are followed by the Oregon Ducks in third, Texas Longhorns in fourth, and Penn State Nittany Lions in fifth. Rounding out the final AP Top 10 are (6) Georgia, (7) Arizona State, (8) Boise State, (9) Tennessee, and (10) Indiana. The Big Ten led all conferences with four teams in the final Top 10, but the SEC led in number of teams in the overall Top 25 with six.
