In contrast to the Juris Doctor (JD) degree, which is highly competitive and challenging, an LLM is considered one of the easiest master's degrees due to students' prior extensive knowledge of the law. However, critics argue that completing an LLM program doesn't provide much of a career advantage or salary increase. Yet, the specialized knowledge gained in this field can be beneficial when representing clients, and there may be opportunities for networking as well. What makes these programs relatively easy is the lack of required science and mathematics courses, as well as less pressure to begin practicing law immediately. Nevertheless, meeting admissions requirements, such as having a Juris Doctorate and a license to practice law, can still be challenging. Ultimately, prospective students should have realistic expectations about the demands of any graduate degree program, including those with a reputation for being easy. study update by DQ Staff released in November 2020 further reading options are available
