Great Eagle Bow

In *The Legend of Zelda: Tears of the Kingdom*, the four Champions of Hyrule's past are gone but far from forgotten, with each of them having left their mark on Hyrule and its people. Revali of the Rito was one of these champions, and his weapon of choice can be recreated for use by Link. In *The Legend of Zelda: Tears of the Kingdom*, Link must investigate disturbances in several different regions of Hyrule in order to gather information about Princess Zelda, along with the Demon King who waits in the shadows. Investigating the intense blizzard that assails the Rito Village is essential to gaining access to the Great Eagle Bow since it can only be obtained once the blizzard has ended. Due to this quest only becoming available after the blizzard has ended, this guide may contain some spoilers regarding the aftermath of the blizzard and related plot details. Legacy of the Rito Once Teba has given his original Great Eagle Bow to Tulin, Link can speak with him in the Rito Village to hear his plans to construct a new bow. He then offers to make one for Link as well, as long as Link is able to provide the needed materials. These materials are a Swallow Bow, five bundles of Wood, and three Diamond. Of these, the Diamonds are likely to prove the most troublesome, with the other components being relatively easy to come by in the area around the Rito Village. Diamonds are dropped sometimes by ore deposits that have a golden glow, and players can save before breaking said ore deposits to reload and try again if they don't get their desired drops. Diamonds can also be found in chests in some Shrines, and are sold for a staggering fee of 1000 Rupees each at a shop in Goron City periodically. Players will likely have to rely on luck to get hold of the necessary diamonds, unless they have 3000 Rupees to spare and are willing to wait for the shop inventory to change if they don't currently have diamonds. To find a Swallow Bow, players should check the Flight Range, north of Rito Village, and pick one up there. Like most items found lying around in the game, this bow will respawn whenever a Blood Moon occurs. Check this guide for further details on where to find Swallow Bows. Wood is the easiest to obtain, so players should just grab an axe and start chopping trees into logs, and then logs into wood. The Great Eagle Bow is a fantastically powerful bow, dealing 28 damage per arrow while firing three arrows at once. This allows it to dish out incredible damage at a range, without using up extra arrows or fused materials. Indeed, the bow will turn a single arrow and material into three of the resulting fused arrow when fired, allowing for some incredibly powerful combinations. Triple elemental or bomb arrows can tear through entire groups of enemies with ease. While the Bow will eventually break, players can make use of this trick to repair weapons or circumvent that issue. A new Great Eagle Bow can be obtained from Teba by bringing him the materials a second time, so even if it breaks it can be obtained again as long as players can track down those pesky diamonds a second time. The Legend of Zelda: Tears of the Kingdom is available for Nintendo Switch. The diversity of weapons and gear in *Zelda: Tears of the Kingdom* means players can essentially enter combat with any approach they choose. Some weapons are naturally better than others - with the Great Eagle Bow undoubtedly one of them. But how do you get it and what can it do for Link in *Zelda: TOTK*? Some weapons - like the Master Sword - tie into *Tears of the Kingdom*'s main narrative and others, like the Dusk Claymore, can be found at one set location. The Great Eagle Bow is slightly different in that it fits into *Zelda* lore. The Champions of Hyrule were chosen to fight the Calamity Ganon and one of them, Revali, wielded the Great Eagle Bow as his weapon of choice. A reincarnation of the Great Eagle Bow is available for Link in *TOTK*. It does require some progress in the story so minor spoilers may follow, but know that it's essential information to earn the Champion's weapon. Disturbances across Hyrule are investigative fodder for Link in *TOTK*. One is a blizzard affecting Rito Village, which Link must investigate and end will earn you the Great Eagle Bow. After this, players can go and initiate conversation with Tulin, a NPC found in Rito Village. He'll offer to make Link another Great Eagle Bow so long as the protagonist can supply him with certain items. These are: A Swallow Bow 5 Bundles of Wood 3 Diamonds The Swallow Bow can be acquired via an amibo and is also found at three different locations in Hyrule. These are: Hebra Peak, Flight Range, and Talonto Peak. Five bundles of wood should be in most players inventories and, if it isn't, just chop a few trees down. It's a very strong weapon, firing three bows simultaneously. Each that hits its target will deal 28 damage, meaning a possible 84 damage can be dealt per shot. He'll tell you he can craft you a great weapon if you bring him the following materials: Swallow Bow 5x Wood Bundles 3x DiamondsOnce you have all the materials, talk to Teba again to get the bow. The Great Eagle Bow is a weapon in *The Legend of Zelda: Tears of the Kingdom* that the Rito Champion, Revali, previously wielded. However, to unlock the ability to obtain this bow, Link must first complete the Wind Temple and defeat Colgera, the boss. While facing the same weapon durability in *Zelda: TOTK* that fans grew to know in *Zelda: BOTW*, powerful weapons are even more valuable as they tend to be more durable, and it never hurts to have extra. However, each comes at a price, and to obtain the Great Eagle Bow, Link must be willing to give up quite a lot. How To Complete Legacy Of The Rito Quest For Zelda *TOTK*'s Great Eagle Bow After the Wind Temple in *Zelda: Tears of the Kingdom* is completed, and the blizzard has cleared, Link can head to Rito Village to speak with Teba. Teba will inform Link that since his original Great Eagle Bow was given to Tulin, he intends to make a new one, including this bow. However, for Link to gather the materials necessary for Teba to craft it, Link will need to gather a Swallow Bow, 5x Wood Bundles, and 3x Diamonds. While the wood is easy enough to come by, Link likely needs the other two materials to spare, so he will need to find them. If Link doesn't already have 5x Wood Bundles or just used them all by making fires in *Zelda: TOTK*, then this is the first thing he should gather. Simply head over to any tree nearby and start chopping. Once the tree is down, chop it once more to turn it into Wood which can then be collected. Link will need to do this a couple of times in order to gather five. After collecting all of those, the next thing to track down is the Swallow Bow. This may take a bit of searching, but it doesn't. The Swallow Bow is right there near Rito Village as well. To grab the Swallow Bow, head North of the Rito Village and visit Kenali in the Flight Range. The easiest way to find him is to head to the Rospro Pass Skyview Tower and then head West until reaching the cliff. Then paraglide down until you see Kenali's little mountain-side hut. The Swallow Bow is sitting right next to him. If it was already collected and is no longer there, Summoning a Blood Moon in *Zelda: TOTK* will reset it. After gathering that, players will then need to decide whether they would like to go and hunt Ore Deposits for a chance at finding the Diamonds or buy them in Goron City. Some Diamonds can also be found in Chests inside of Shrines, so be sure to try to collect all Chests when completing Shrines in *Zelda: TOTK*. While finding them through Ore Deposits is the cheaper alternative, it is also the most time-consuming as there is no way to guarantee an Ore Deposit will produce a Diamond, so it comes down to luck. Unfortunately, the alternative, which will guarantee Link three Diamonds, will also cost him 3,000 Rupees. In Goron City, a merchant will rotate out his supply to occasionally sell Diamonds for 1,000 Rupees a piece. Regardless of which method players decide on, after all materials are gathered, Teba can craft Link the Great Eagle Bow in *The Legend of Zelda: Tears of the Kingdom*, which has a power of 28 and shoots 3x arrows. The Great Eagle Bow is a legendary weapon previously carried by Rito Village's most powerful warriors. In-game this bow is one of the best bows to acquire with the ability to shoot multiple shots and 28 of attack power. This guide will provide you with the information on how to obtain this legendary bow including the side quests and items required. Starting Legacy of the Rito Side Quest Head to Rito Village Head to Rito Village Climb to the highest room in order to start the side quest Teba will ask you for three items in order to make the bow In order to start Legacy of the Rito Side Quest you need to finish all the main quests that cover Rito village, so if you're still very early on the game please follow the main quest before attempting this guide. Now our first destination will be Rito Village, take the stairs all the way up to the room where Teba is located, and once there talk to him to start the side quest. He will ask you to bring him a Swallow Bow, Five Bundles of wood, and three Diamonds. Swallow Bow Location Flight Range location The bow is located at your right The bow is located at your right The Swallow Bow can be found at the Flight Range near Donoc's Pass, all you need to do is talk to Kaneli the giant bird for the first time. After that reach out to his right side and pick up the Arrows and the Swallow Bow. How to get Diamonds? Head to Goron diamond shop The easiest way to acquire diamonds is by simply buying them Diamonds can be acquired using multiple ways in *Tears of the Kingdom*. For example, you can find rare mining stones, save before breaking them and keep loading your save until you get a diamond. Another way is by farming Taluses across Hyrule or inside the depth. My favorite is by simply buying the diamond from Goron City, keep in mind that a piece of diamond will cost you 1000 rupees so make sure to farm some rupees before visiting the shop. How to Get Woods? You can chop some trees outside to get some wood bundles You can chop some tree outside to get some wood bundles Wood is the easiest to acquire out of all three components, all you need to do is chop some trees using your sword. Once the tree is down, chop it one more time to create wood. Making the Great Eagle Bow Talk back to Teba Talk back to Teba The Great Eagle Bow Now that we have all three components, head back to Rito Village and reach the top once again. Give Teba the three items and he will make you the bow in seconds, now the bow is all yours, keep in mind that you can always remake the bow after breaking it by visiting Teba and completing the same side quest over and over again. Now as you can see the bow offers a generous amount of 28 attack power and a triple shot which makes it one of the most effective weapons against bosses like Lynels, and Gleeks. Tabantha Frontier Bow 28 The Great Eagle Bow is the Bow that the Rito Champion Revali once used before he was defeated by Windblight Ganon.[1] This Bow belongs to the Rito Gear equipment archetype.[3] It is said that Revali could fire Arrows from this Bow with the speed of a gale, making him adept at aerial combat.[1] Teba claims that it is too heavy for the average Rito to wield, as they would end up losing all their speed.[4] However, he states that Revali's strength and speed allowed him to counter the detriments of the Weapon.[5] Kaneli will gift Link the Great Eagle Bow in Rito Village as a reward for calming Divine Beast Vah Medoh.[6] This is done at the suggestion of Teba, who was impressed by how Link handled his own Bow against the Divine Beast.[7] It can be retrieved from inside a Treasure Chest in Kaneli's House. If the Great Eagle Bow breaks or becomes irreversibly lost, Harth can make a new Great Eagle Bow for Link if he provides a Swallow Bow, five bundles of Wood, and a Diamond.[8] If it was dropped somewhere but can still be reobtained, Harth will instead recommend trying to find it first, as it is expensive to make.[9] The Great Eagle Bow is a powerful Bow for aerial combat that can fire three Arrows at once, similar to the Lynel Bow and its counterparts. It also contains the Quick Draw upgrade as a hidden feature. Being made of wood, it will burn if it touches Fire or is equipped in a Scorching Climate. It will also float if dropped in Water, and it will not attract Lightning during Thunderstorms or conduct Electricity. Finally, the Great Eagle Bow cannot be picked up with the Magnus Rune. Other Appearances[] Hyrule Warriors: Age of Calamity[] The Great Eagle Bow is wielded by the Rito Champion, Revali. He wields it in several cutscenes. For example, Revali uses the Great Eagle Bow against Link during their first encounter. He briefly aimed it at a surge of Monster on the way back to Hyrule Castle. Revali also used it to defend himself against Windlight Ganon, which he later shot Bomb Arrow. Finally, he opened fire with it to protect Teba from a group of Guardians. It requires you to complete the Regional Phenomena quest in Hebra, while getting some other crafting items along the way. Here's our guide to help you get the Great Eagle Bow in *Zelda: Tears of the Kingdom*. Minor spoilers follow. As mentioned earlier, the Great Eagle Bow requires that you finish the entirety of the Hebra regional quest, which would grant you Tulin's Sage Companion ability. Once that's done, head back to the topmost section of Rito Village, where you'll find Teba, Tulin's father. Talk to him, and he'll offer to craft the weapon as part of the Legacy of the Rito quest. Here are the materials that you need: 5x Wood — Easy enough to acquire since you just need to chop down trees and logs. 3x Diamond — These can be found in precious ore deposits, such as those in the Sky World. Some are also rewarded in Shrines, like Jochi-Thiga/Rock For Sale. Moreover, if you already have a single Diamond, you could just dupe the materials. 1x Swallow Bow — There are a select few locations, such as the one we mention below. Screenshot by GameSkinny The TotK Great Eagle Bow requires a single Swallow Bow. The location I went to is fairly easy to reach. From the Rospro Pass Skyview Tower, use the launch pad and glide a short distance to the west. There, you'll find the Rito Flight Path area. The coordinates are (-3789, 2320, 0161). There's a nearby hut with an NPC. Right next to the fella is a Swallow Bow and some arrows. As far as I can tell, since the weapon is just out in the open, there's a good chance that it will respawn each new Bloodmoon Cycle. Screenshot by GameSkinny Screenshot by GameSkinny Once you have all the materials, return to Teba so you can obtain the *Zelda: Tears of the Kingdom* Great Eagle Bow. It has a +28 attack power rating. However, its main selling point is that it can fire up to three projectiles simultaneously, though the shot will only use up one arrow. Another factor worth considering is that if the original item breaks and you need a replacement, you'll just need to reacquire the materials and hand them over to Teba. Then again, I would also suggest just duping weapons to avoid the hassle. That's how to get the Great Eagle Bow in *Tears of the Kingdom*. You can find other regional legends/unique weapons throughout the campaign. Examples include the Lightscale Trident from Zora's Domain, the Boulder Breaker from Goron City, and the Scimitar of the Seven/Daybreaker combo from Gerudo Town.
