Many people assume that if an airline isn't fully booked for a flight, they might drop the prices a few days before take-off. That's often not true. Airlines tend to have enough demand from last-minute business travelers, who will pay even a higher last-minute price. This means airlines tend to offer cheaper tickets up front and gradually increase their prices closer to the flight. Of course, that doesn't mean there won't be price drops, so getting good at planning around a good deal is the best tool in not breaking the bank for travel. Just like there are best practices for getting a good deal, there's some strategy in approaching tickets at the last minute. Start by checking surrounding airports. You might be able to fly out of New York's LaGuardia, for example, at a lower price than JFK. You can also look at one-way tickets. This gives you the flexibility to book different airlines that offer the cheapest flight each way. If you're traveling in a group, it might be worth booking separately. Some people might want to avoid budget airlines, whereas others might like the idea of saving as much as possible. You can also book the cheapest seat versus trying to reserve five or more tickets. There is typically a golden window for booking flights—not too far in advance and not too late. The best deals are usually found 1-3 months in advance for domestic flights and 2-8 months in advance for international tickets. But remember, there's always a reason, even if it's not immediately clear. Weather is a big one - planes can't fly safely in bad weather like snowstorms, hurricanes, or extreme heat. Airlines might cancel flights for security reasons too. Sometimes planes get mechanical problems, but this doesn't usually mean they're canceled. Mechanical issues only cause delays, and you should always check the airline's policy if your flight is delayed. Being kind to staff can help them be kinder to you. Missing crew or aircraft can happen too, so don't panic - the airline will try to fix it. Airlines have control over their prices and schedules, especially at hubs where one airline dominates. The cheapest time to book flights varies depending on your trip. For domestic trips, 1-3 months in advance is usually best. For international trips, 2-8 months in advance works better. Prices go up during peak season - like summer or holidays - but you can find deals before or after that. Shoulder seasons have good weather and prices right before or after peak season. If you want to travel during peak season, book early. Learning how to find cheap flights can save you a lot of money.
